Dear Judge Lynch:

I performed a psychiatric evaluation of the defendant, Rhonda Glover, on 10/19/2004 for the purpose of rendering an opinion as to whether the defendant is competent to stand trial. The purpose of the evaluation and the fact that it was not confidential was explained. It was also explained that a report of the evaluation would be sent to the court, District Attorney and Ms Glover's defense attorney. Furthermore, it was explained that I was not her treating physician and that no patient-physician relationship exists. The evaluation was done by means of psychiatric interview and mental status examination. Ms Glover's defense attorney, Mr. Charles Grigson, was present throughout the entire interview. In addition, I reviewed the medical chart and talked with staff at the jail. I also reviewed the following case related documents:

#### **HISTORY:**

Records indicate that Ms Glover has a history of being diagnosed with bipolar disorder, psychosis not otherwise specified, and substance abuse. Ms Glover indicated that she has been to treatment for substance abuse but disagreed with diagnoses of any other mental illness. She is not currently prescribed any psychiatric medication.

#### **MENTAL STATUS EXAMINATION:**

Upon evaluation, Ms Glover sat calmly throughout the interview. Her defense attorney, Mr. Charles Grigson was also present throughout the interview. Ms Glover was cooperative and responsive. Her speech was coherent but at times tangential. She was highly focused on religious references at times. She demonstrated some thoughts with a delusional quality although she attributed them to being the beliefs of the alleged victim. For example, she talked about caves being under her house, about the alleged victim being involved in human sacrifices and cannibalism. She seemed preoccupied with these beliefs about the alleged victim to the point that it was difficult to focus on relevant issues regarding her case. For example, she discussed a neighbor having found a child's shoe above fresh snow implying that it was proof of the sacrifices in which she believed the alleged victim was involved. She also discussed having seen a van with a couple inside. She stated the van pulled up in front of her house and said the couple was going to drop off a child in pull-up diapers but the couple saw Ms Glover and left; again implying this had something to do with the human sacrifices that she believes were occurring.

Ms Glover said that her mood was "hard to tell in a place like this (jail)". Her affect was within normal range, tearful at times but pleasant in general. She was oriented to person, place and time. She denied any auditory or visual hallucinations. She denied any suicidal or homicidal ideation.

Ms Glover appeared to be of high intelligence.
